

#### **DIFFERENT PHILOSOPHIES OF COMMUNION**

Transubstantiation — bread/wine become the literal body & blood of Christ

Consubstantiation — The literal flesh & blood of Christ co-exist with the bread & wine.

## DIFFERENT PHILOSOPHIES OF COMMUNION

- Memorial The bread and juice/wine are merely symbols.
- Real Spiritual Presence The real presence of Christ is there spiritually but how is a mystery.





# COMMON WAYS WE ARE BROKEN Tests/Trials Challenges/Struggles Betrayal Isolation Choice/Letting us do what we want






How to determine where you, or someone else, is in the process?
