


Predestined for adoption

- 1. Adoption was a contract between families
- 2. The adoptee was often an adult
- 3. Only sons could inherit



Adoption in ancient Rome was primarily a legal procedure for transferring paternal power (potestas) to ensure succession in the male line within Roman patriarchal society.



<u>Sui juris</u> is a Latin phrase that literally means "of one's own right".


