Purposed for testimony (Luke 2:25). Luke 2:36-37 (NLT) Anna, a prophet, was also there in the Temple. She was the daughter of Phanuel from the tribe of Asher, and she was very old. Her husband died when they had been married only seven years. Then she lived as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the Temple but stayed there day and night, worshiping God with fasting and prayer.	

What Anna teaches us about how to know our purpose? 1. Unwavering dedication. 2. Stay the course even through difficult life challenges and setbacks. 3. Committed to your faith (worship, fasting, and prayer). Purpose never dies. It hides away in our dreams waiting to be made reality.
